

CPCC MOTORCYCLE SAFETY CLASS REQUIREMENTS

- **To maintain class structure and to meet the required completion times, the class will start at the time scheduled. If a student misses any portion of the classroom or riding exercises they may be excluded from the remaining riding portions of the class, forfeiting the right to completion certificates.**
- **You must have the ability to ride a bicycle in order to properly progress through the class in the time allotted.**
- **You must bring the following to each class session and wear during the range sessions:**
 - **Helmet:** Must be DOT approved and at least a ¾ helmet, covering the ears; no half helmets, skull or beanie caps.
 - **Eye Protection:** Helmet face shield, prescription glasses, sunglasses, and safety glasses are satisfactory.
 - **Long Sleeves:** Any clothing that covers the arms down to the wrist.
 - **Gloves:** Must be full-fingered.
 - **Pants:** Sturdy material containing no holes. May not be wind pants, warm-up pants or stretch pants.
 - **Foot Protection:** Must cover anklebone. High top, leather tennis shoes and hiking boots are satisfactory. Boots **with no or low** heels are preferred. Please tuck in long shoelaces
- In accordance to CPCC student policies and procedures, participants who act in unsafe or unruly manor that causes disruption to the class or an unsafe learning environment will be asked to leave the class immediately forfeiting the remainder of the class.
- Motorcycle safety courses have a progressive curriculum. Each exercise teaches new skills and builds on previously learned ones and must be completed in the course allotted time to meet the certification requirements. If the student is unable to complete the objectives of each exercise or miss any portion of a range exercise will result in a failure and exclusion or the remaining skills portion of the class. You may continue with the classroom portion of the course, but will not be awarded a completion card.
- Safety for students and instructors is critical in this course. The motorcycle safety course can be stressful to new and experienced riders. The large group nature of the class limits individual instruction time however instructors will do their best to help every student meet the objectives of the course in a safe and timely manner. Students may be excluded from riding portions if they show an excessive fear, nervousness other behaviors that is foreseen as danger to any student or rider coach.
- The Motorcycle Safety Foundation and the North Carolina DMV Waiver card are awarded by the course instructors based on overall performance as well as the skill and written exams. Passing of the required exams does not guarantee completion cards will be awarded.

With unsuccessful course completion, for any reason, re-registration will be at the student's expense
